The Chosen

We are trying something new this winter. Our worship and study will be inspired by the movie and TV series The Chosen (Season 1). The Chosen is a groundbreaking historical drama based on the life of Jesus, seen through the eyes of those who knew him. Set against the backdrop of Roman oppression in first-century Israel, the show shares an authentic and intimate look at Jesus' revolutionary life and teachings.

The Chosen is one of the most-watched shows in the world. Currently Season 4 is showing in the theaters, but we are starting with Season 1 and that is available on Netflix and free on the app from Angel Studios. Casey will send a link each week for the episode we will explore in worship. Studies are being offered Sunday afternoons at 12:30 PM around the table in the church office and at the Women's Wednesdays study group following at 9:30 AM, same location.

In our culture where belief in God in declining, this series is peaking people's interest and inspiring them to ask questions. By going deeper into the scriptures and faith themes of the movie, I thought it would give us a common language to speak with our neighbors and friends who don't have a faith community.

Being chosen by Jesus has beautiful and far-reaching implications - although it says even more about the Chooser than the choose-ees. We are loved because He's love. We are saved because He's merciful. We belong to the family of God because he invites us, making the Bible and all its promises as true for us today as it was for God's chosen nation.

I hope that you participate by watching the movie, and engaging in worship and study with us. You can purchase the companion study books for deeper learning, although not required. They are available through the office and on Amazon.

As one of our small group leaders noted, "We are looking forward to this Bible Study that is sure to deepen your faith and increase your knowledge in a new and exciting way. This is a powerful series and God is changing people's lives thru it."

Like this afternoon, I sat down to the computer for my last "Hi y'all" for 2023 with the full intention of starting with "People get ready, there's a train a'coming." I went to YouTube to listen to the Curtis Mayfield rendition to put me "in the mood", and immediately my eyes were drawn to a new talk presented by Priscilla Shirer entitled "I AM WHO GOD SAYS I AM", and the train left without me.



Now, in case you didn't know, Priscilla is a very powerful motivational speaker, and she did not disappoint. But the reason I was drawn into listening to that talk at this time was because In Exodus 3:14 God says to Moses "I am who I am. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I am has sent me to you." In John 8:58, Jesus says "Very truly I tell you, before Abraham was born, I am!", identifying himself as the very same I AM. My Star Word Was "Peliberate" - What Poes That Mean?

Pastor Wendy's Retirement Letter

As an adjective "deliberate" describes something that is intentional or done with great care. It is the opposite of impulsive. As a verb it means to engage in long careful consideration. I have been deliberating over my retirement for about a year. I absolutely love the people of Davidsonville UMC and surrounding community which made this discernment very difficult. The past seven plus years have been amazing. Together we have been making a positive impact in people's lives.

After prayerful consideration, I have decided that God is calling me to a new season of life. The poet Ecclesiastes wrote, "There's a season for everything and a time for every matter under the heavens: a time for giving birth and a time for dying, a time for planting and a time for uprooting what was planted." (Ecc. 3:1-2) I am ready to be uprooted from this community to be planted in another place for the next season of life. I am looking forward to making a positive impact in the lives of those who are closest to me, my husband, children, and grandchildren.

I have communicated deliberately with our District Superintendent Rev. Sarah Schlieckert so that the Bishop and Cabinet can prepare well for sending you your next pastor. They have listened carefully to your passion for ministry to young families, sharing the gospel one bite at a time, and offering HUGS; hope, understanding and grief support. The process of deciding who might serve Davidsonville UMC next is complicated. Patience will be needed as we wait for the Cabinet's decision. And we are not just going to sit around as we wait. We will continue with vigor to reach out to our community so that people continue to Know, Love, and Serve God and Others in Unity. My retirement doesn't start until until July 1, 2024, and I will be running the race with endurance until then.

John Wesley developed a prayer that he expected pastors and congregations to pray each new year as a way of remembering and renewing their baptismal promises. The Covenant Prayer describes a life deliberately devoted to following Jesus and serving as Christ's representative in the world he loves and is working to redeem. The line resonating with me this year is - "Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee." I am preparing to be laid aside for a new season, retirement - but not until July!
