PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Get out of bed, Jerusalem! Wake up! Put your face in the sunlight... The whole world is wrapped in darkness, all people sunk in deep darkness, but God rises on you. God's glory breaks over you! Isaiah 60:1-6

The butterfly has long been a symbol of the resurrection of Jesus as well as the resurrection of believers as we emerge with the power of new life.

Did You Know?

Did you know that the most economical way to donate to the church was through automated electronic transfers from your bank account?

We often list the three ways of giving as; *Giving Envelopes* (checks and cash), *Online Giving* (at <u>dumc.net</u>), and **Text Giving** (to 410-324-6399).

Giving envelopes are great. Of course, it doesn't cost us anything to deposit checks or cash. The envelopes themselves, cost \$1-\$2 per box. When people are absent from church, generally their donations are absent also. When they return, they usually return with one week's giving, skipping the donations for the weeks that they were absent. It is hard to slip a month's worth of contributions into the envelope if you're accustomed to a weekly budget.

Online giving is convenient, especially for those who don't attend often. Folks who are donating because they are attending a special event, or want to give in memory of someone, or have been blessed by our space and people, can just go to our website, and make a donation. However, we lose a percentage (approx. 2.77%) on each credit card transaction. Often people will give a little more (an extra 28 cents for every \$10) to cover the bank fees, which helps.

Texting to give is another very convenient method and carries the same fees.

Electronic Fund Transfers (ETFs) from your bank account are FREE. They do not have service fees!

Here is how it works: You initiate the process by filling out the form and returning it to the church. You decide how much you want to give and when (once or twice a month). Then the funds are transferred from your account to the church account as per your instructions. Magic! You don't have to write any more checks or put aside any cash for an envelope. Your donation occurs as per your instructions whether you are traveling, staying home and resting, or worshipping online. You have complete control and can stop the transfers if your circumstances change. Remember-there are no extra fees.

We are grateful for each and every donation we receive. Every gift is counted, reported, and used carefully and wisely for the work of the church.

You are helping us reach people so that they come to know, love, and serve God and others in unity. You are helping us make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Your gifts. offerings and tithes are making a difference. Thank you.



Dear Gues,

I am so excited to take this opportunity to write to you so closely to the sermon series of the Lord's Prayer. I'd like to address the words, "Give US this day OUR daily bread." In John, Chapter 21, we find Jesus asking Peter, "Do you love me?" and the answer: "Lord you know all things; you know that I love you." To which (of course you know), comes the reply, "Feed my sheep." It doesn't take a great leap to work out that, perhaps, there's more than bread being asked for. To quote Dr. Adam Hamilton in his book THE LORD'S PRAYER:

"Jesus knew that we can have all the bread that we want, and yet be spiritually starved, just as we can have all the wealth that we could hope for, yet still be impoverished, but when Jesus told us to pray for our essential, substantial bread, existential bread, the bread that sustains our souls, the bread we need to survive – he was inviting the hungry to pray for physical bread, and inviting those who have enough to pray for those who don't and be moved to share. He was teaching us to ask for and receive the bread that satisfies our souls.

When you pray these words, "Give us this day our daily bread" I challenge you to think of those who might not have enough or those who have other needs, physical or emotional. Be aware of those in need and invite God to use you to be an instrument of His peace. Pray that God can use you to provide the bread of life to those suffering the poverty of heart and soul. Pray that the areas of your life that need sustenance are fed.

Never, never feel inadequate to wear the shoes of a disciple. The Holy Spirit will equip you as the need arises. The original disciples answered a call to follow and followed without hesitation. We are called and equipped to be Christian examples. We are called to feed His sheep. The awesome ministry MERCY CHEFS feeds disaster victims three meals a day who, otherwise might have nothing and who have lost everything. Our own barbeque team, Tongues of Fire, spreads the Gospel one bite at a time to support mission efforts. You, too, can be a to-go meal for the needy. Simply by touching a heart you can feed a soul. We are blessed to be a blessing. Share the Gospel (and sometimes use words)!

Gifted! A New Projector!






Barbara Whittington
