PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The joy I feel today is, in part, because of you. Praying you feel it too.



Dear Ones,


I hope you all had the opportunity to listen to Pastor Paul's message on the Prodigal Father. We all know this story, but the message has never touched me as did the message that day. The last sermon I heard preached on the prodigal son had been a favorite, and oddly both Pastor Paul's and the last focused on the words, "while he was still a long distance away, his father saw him coming, and filled with love, he ran to his son."



Now, the last time I heard this message preached the minister focused on "he ran to his son". He RAN. He was so HAPPY to see the return of his beloved son, that he RAN. He was so excited and eager to greet the son who had been lost to him that he put on the nearest sandals he could find and RAN. The minister stopped here and looked down to her feet and noticed that her shoes did not match! Must be a girl thing. Who woulda thunk it?

Pastor Paul focused on "while he was still a long distance away, his father saw him coming." He SAW him coming (while he was a long distance away) He must have been LOOKING for him! It had been years, but he SAW him coming because he was LOOKING. In Jewish tradition the child would have been disowned for what he had done. Men of means did not run; an elder would have met him at the city gates and thrown down a clay pot to shatter before him as a sign of his shame. The word for this punishment is 'kezazah'. Jesus would have known the tradition, but he wanted you to know that your heavenly father patiently waits for your return, and He never loses sight of you.

Sadly, I lived through a prodigal story which did not have a happy ending. I was guilty of the kezazah and still live with that guilt. My prodigal came home in a box. I have finally, after years, been able to put my guilt to rest, and my son lies peacefully in our church cemetery. Please know that God will always wait for you and will always welcome you home.
